

DAVENPORT SENIOR CENTER TO CLOSE

Loss of Senior Meal Program and other services

Due to a number of economic factors (including the current economy, high cost of fuel and food, Covid restrictions, loss of members/financial support), the Davenport Senior Center is closing. They have applied for many grants and hope this will be a temporary closure as they await funding from those sources.

Unfortunately, this closure means the Center, which provides approximately 30 local seniors three days per week, will not be able to provide meals. (The Center is in the process of acquiring a food service contract with the State of Washington but this is taking longer than expected.) Other important services will stop as well: The Center provides work space for Aging and Adult Care of Central Washington several days per month, which helps to coordinate care for local seniors; and they work closely with the local hospital and clinic with presentations to help seniors stay healthy and safe in their own home.


